

CHIEF'S MINUTE(s)

February 13, 2019

- Incidents** – January, 2019 18 total, 10 medical, 2 structure, 2 mva, 3 natural cover, 1 public safety/assist. Variety of medical incidents and structure fire in Dist 2 with automatic aid.
- Training** – Training for the month included RIT/Mayday classroom and practical, multicompany drill at D2 tower, medical with Dr Bodenhamer visit. Three firefighters (Fox, Chitwood, Bustrum) completed the NFPA 16 hr. Haz Mat course with Roseburg Fire. Attended Budget Law Training with Jerry Harris. Attended annual “Paradigm” Gas Pipeline training and mock incident with County Emergency personnel and Pipeline companies.
- Firefighters** - Fit test of masks as annual OSHA requirement completed with new computerized testing. Continuing driver/operator training. Met with Evergreen Occupational Health about designing a simple physical that meets SDAO requirements for drivers. Captain Radway attending NFPA Safety and Health Officer training at DPSST 2/16-17. Tuition and two meals/day free but providing lodging and 1090.
- Explorers** - Participated in all ff training and tasks.
- Equipment** - All VFA equipment in except PPE. Due Friday the 15th. 1070 and 1090 serviced. 1030 road/pump switch malfunctioned, repaired by Hughes Fire Equipment. No invoice yet. Met with Pierce representative about new 1031, we are working on more specs to compare and price. Continuing annual preventative maintenance this month and over winter as budgeted. 1080 and heavy vehicles next. New scene lights were recalled by manufacturer, vendor replaced them with new “improved” model. Quarterly air sample test done for breathing air. Annual SCBA flow tests of all units completed with a few repairs and maintenance. Invoice of \$1500 plus tonight. Starting to age. Cascade/Coffel
- Inventory** - Updated inventories for all units in progress and will be placed in manual in office.
- Facility** Contacted additional local vendor (All Wired Up)/contractor about security system. Final estimate due before meeting. Hopefully we can choose tonight as we are already approved for the initial estimate.
- Office/Admin** – SDAO/SDIS annual insurance invoice in tonight’s financial at \$7175. Due March 1st. Grants – State Bond Program due March 1st, submitting for emergency power. They have the equipment they have chosen to provide if successful, no estimates or purchasing involved. See samples. New State fire report system transition completed, having issues with the system overall. We are submitting incident reports but training records still not available. Haz Mat inventory due to State March 1st, another new web based program.
- Miscellaneous** - IT review and inventory. Thanks to Director Harris for making it all work as we transition to online FF1 training County wide. Worked on annual report for 2018 and way too much time on State reporting system. Budget Committee members and Director elections coming, should make choices in March. Naomi Schulze memorial.
